Community:

Organized in groups of 4-5; with 20+ in your Leadership class, many opportunities for the year!

- an afternoon in a Seniors home
- an afternoon or weekend activity involving elementary or middle schools
- bake sale/Krispy Kreme sales with proceeds going to a community cause
- car wash for a community cause
- toy drive for needy children in the community
- food drive before the summer break
- volunteering at a local soup kitchen
- volunteering through student mentorship programs (Big Brothers Big Sisters)

School-based:

- **Stars of the School**: either gold hearts or red stars all around the school with student names on it; bring the heart or star to the receive a prize (stickers to pencils!)
- BYOB: all students and staff have to bring a banana... Leadership provides tubs of ice cream, toppings and bowls in the foyer (bananas can be sold for \$1 and given to a local charity)
- Remembrance Day in May: prepare and host a supper for veterans from your local Legion (Branch 21). Intent is to let them know they are appreciated all year, not just in November. - *Teacher Recognition*: can be done twice a year; once at the start of school or winter break and the last one in May/June. Here are some novel ideas that are cheap and fun!
