WHY: The Small Number films

incorporate problem-solving and Indigenous traditions in animated stories about a young Indigenous boy who has an impressive aptitude for mathematics and also a proclivity for getting into trouble. His adventures to date, take place in different physical contexts in different Indigenous communities, and yet the clever playful protagonist remains the same.

WHO: Grade 4 and Grade 5 students and their teacher from across the Lower Mainland are welcome to participate in the Festival.
