WORKSHOPS

TEACHING CONCEPTS ABOUT PRINT USING BIG BOOKS

PRESENTER: JANE WILSON, LITERACY SPECIALIST - YUKON DEPT OF EDUCATION

Concepts About Print are the cornerstone to early literacy learning, and are essential to success in reading and writing. In this session you will explore ways in which teachers can engage students through the use of big books. By deepening your understanding of the concepts, and digging into the potential of shared reading through big books, you will leave this session with tips, ideas and a renewed sense of purpose.

THE WRITING THIEF: USING MENTOR TEXTS TO TEACH WRITING USING THE TRAITS

PRESENTER: RUTH CULHAM, TEACHER, AUTHOR AND KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Sharing great picture books is a joy for every primary teacher. However, when we look at the books through the lens of the traits, it's possible to use these texts to also teach students how writing works. In this session, participants will sample books that show strength in each of the traits and will learn how to use them to bring energy to the writing classroom along with building skills that strengthen the craft of young writers.

ACCELERATING THE PROGRESS OF VULNERABLE READERS

The focus of this workshop will be on strengthening the reading/writing connection in all students, especially our most at-risk learners. In an interactive manner, the workshop will give examples of an exemplary push-in or pull-out daily reading and writing (word work) intervention that will dramatically accelerate the reading progress for all students. The question "What is possible for students experiencing difficulties in reading?" will be answered.

GUIDED READING FOR FRENCH IMMERSION, OUI OU NON? - EN FRANCIAS

This workshop will focus on questions frequently asked by French Immersion (and French First Language) primary teachers. What exactly IS Guided Reading? What's so special about it? Is it possible in French Immersion or in a French First language program? HARNESSING THE POWER OF ORAL LANGUAGE THROUGH BOOKS - EN FRANCIAS

Conversations centered in books, provide an opportunity for teachers to extend a child's language, strengthening both their reading and writing skills.
