Virtual Guided Tours (Also available in French)

Tours available: *Vancouver History Galleries*, *Cesna?em: the city before the city*; *Haida Now*, and *A Seat at the Table*. Suitable for all grade levels.

Guided tour through our virtual galleries

Engage your students in a virtual experience of our galleries from the comforts of your classrooms! An educator leads students through our 360° virtual galleries via screen sharing, pausing along the way with inquiry-based questions to stimulate creative thinking and critical discussions.

Live stream in-gallery tour

Enjoy an immersive experience of our galleries from the convenience of your device! Students engage in a live-stream tour with an educator, walking through the heart of our galleries with opportunities for a richer experience.

Virtual School Programs (Also available in French)

Participate in a highly engaging virtual learning experience with our most popular curriculum-connected programs adapted for online delivery.

Bring the MOV to your school with Education Kits designed to augment your virtual field trip, making it a “hands-on” interactive learning experience. Education Kits are available for pick up at the MOV and are sanitized and safely quarantined for a minimum of 72 hours between rentals.

Cedar and Sealskin: Grades 1-4

Gain a deeper understanding of First Nations’ traditional culture through Object-Based Learning. Examine belongings from the Pacific Northwest Coast and learn how First Nation Peoples met the basic needs of food, clothing, and shelter.

Add-on: Inuit culture

Cedar & Sealskin can be expanded with an optional add-on to focus on the Inuit culture and belongings through an interactive inquiry-based activity.

Optional Education Kit

The Education Kit supplements the Cedar & Sealskin program and includes First Nations belongings to use during the virtual field trip.

Resilience and Reconciliation: Grades 4-6

Learn about the impact of colonization on the Musqueam First Nation, how they resisted assimilative policies, and the Museum’s role in the reconciliation process by virtually exploring our exhibition: *časna?em, the city before the city*.

Add-on: The Road to Reconciliation

Learn about our shared responsibility in the reconciliation process. Through Object-Based Learning, students use their critical thinking skills and gain a deeper understanding of traditional and contemporary First Nations culture.

This add-on also includes access to a video tour of MOV’s *Haida Now* exhibition by co-curator, Kwiaahwah Jones, where she couples artistic insight with her own personal connections to the entire exhibition and the stories it conveys.

Optional Education Kit

The Education Kit supplements the Road to Reconciliation add-on and includes First Nations belongings to use during the virtual add-on.

Immigration Nation: Grades 5-6

Play an immigration game through our Vancouver History Virtual Galleries. Explore the galleries and examine real suitcases from immigrants while collecting points and money towards immigrating. This program focuses on who immigrates and why, the quality of life for new immigrants, and immigrants’ contributions to Vancouver.

Ancient Worlds: Grades 6-7

Uncover the science of archaeology by investigating artefacts from the ancient cultures of Mesopotamia, Egypt, Indus Valley, China, Greece, and Rome. Work in teams to research and analyze artefacts from the Museum’s Teaching Collection, then formulate and test your hypothesis.

Add-on: Mummification in Ancient Egypt

Ancient Worlds can be expanded with an optional add-on to focus on the process and the significance of mummification in Ancient Egypt. Use your critical thinking skills to gain a deeper understanding of contemporary issues surrounding museum collections and practices.

Optional Education Kit

The Education Kit supplements the Ancient Worlds program and includes artifacts for each civilization studied during the field trip.

Coming soon: A Seat At The Table

Learn about the diversity and challenges of Chinese immigrants’ experience in B.C., their resilience and their pursuit of justice.
