

COASTAL WATERS

Fridays | October 15, 2021-June 24, 2022

Join us to uncover the complexity of the BC coastline. Students are immersed in the ideas of interconnection, ecosystems, water cycles and shoreline wildlife, inspired by works from Burnaby Art Gallery's Permanent Collection including works by Coastal Indigenous artworks. Using watercolour, drawing, and collage, students develop individual mixed-media works that contribute to a group classroom ecosystem project.

COLLECTION DISCOVERY

Tuesdays | October 19, 2021-June 21, 2022 Thursdays | October 21, 2021-June 23, 2022

Discover the Gallery's Permanent Art Collections, through handmade prints by Indigenous Artists. Students make comparisons of the different techniques and elements of meaning in the works, and consider the significance of the ecosystem and environment. Students create their own print inspired by Coast Salish Design.

STRUCTURES & CITIES

Wednesdays | October 20, 2021-June 22, 2022

Imagine, balance, construct, and combine materials to engineer an exciting mini city. Students learn about physics and connecting techniques they can use to support their structures. This workshop applies a horizontal learning approach to engage multiple subjects, encouraging students to get creative. Focus can be adjusted to fit your curriculum.

An art project builds on these ideas, using techniques of layering, colour mixing and collage to create a 'forest' of trees.

ARTIST APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

Fridays | January 7, 14, February 4, 11, 18, 25, April 8, 15 9am-3pm | Free, 8 sessions *participation required on all days

Senior secondary students take on the role of a professional artist to create an exhibition for the gallery. Guided by practising artists, curators, programmers and marketing staff, students create artwork and learn how to develop and promote their show. Students also spend a day touring art spaces — from artist-run centres to commercial galleries. Volunteer hours accrued may be used towards career placement programs.
